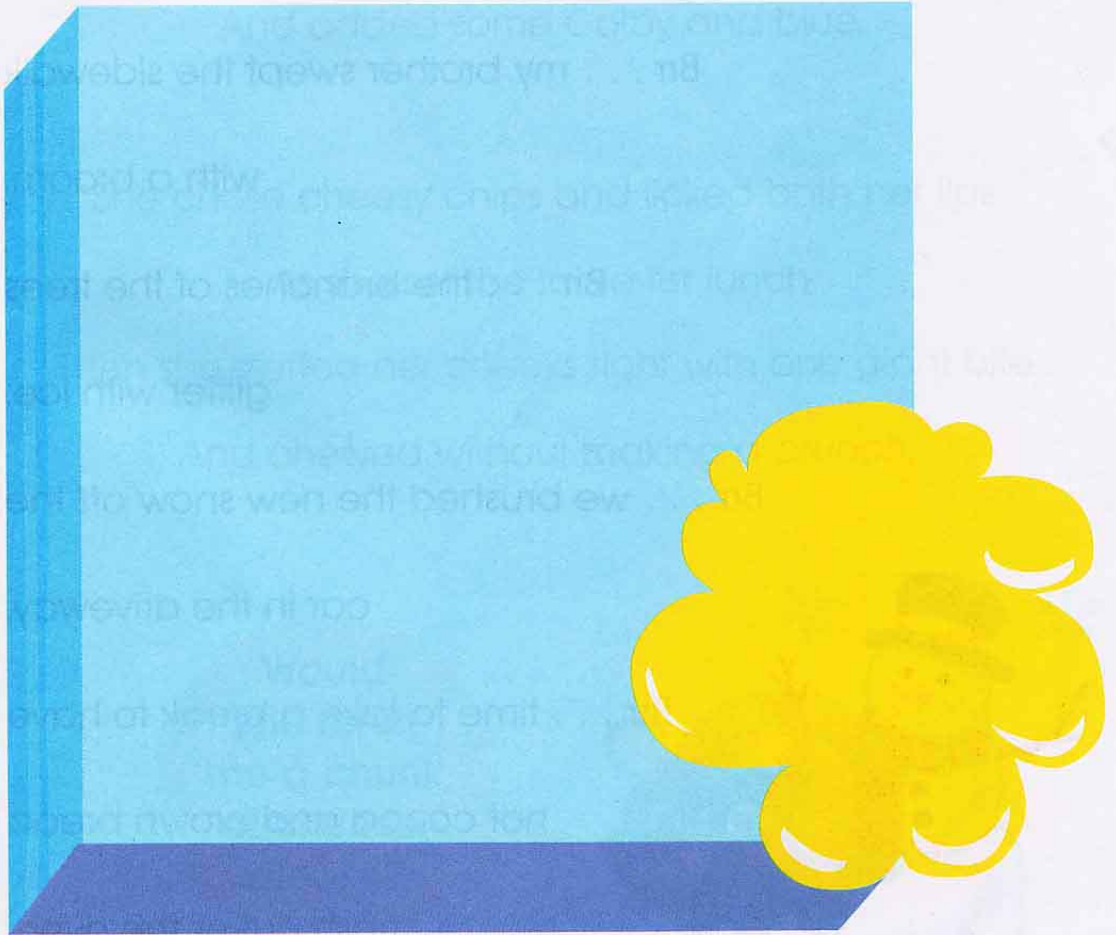

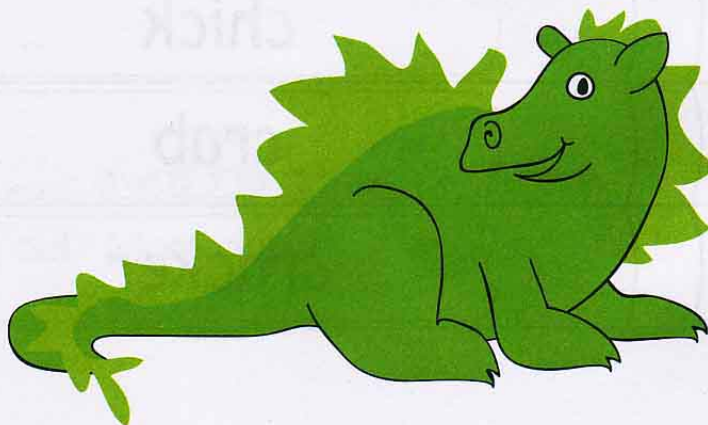

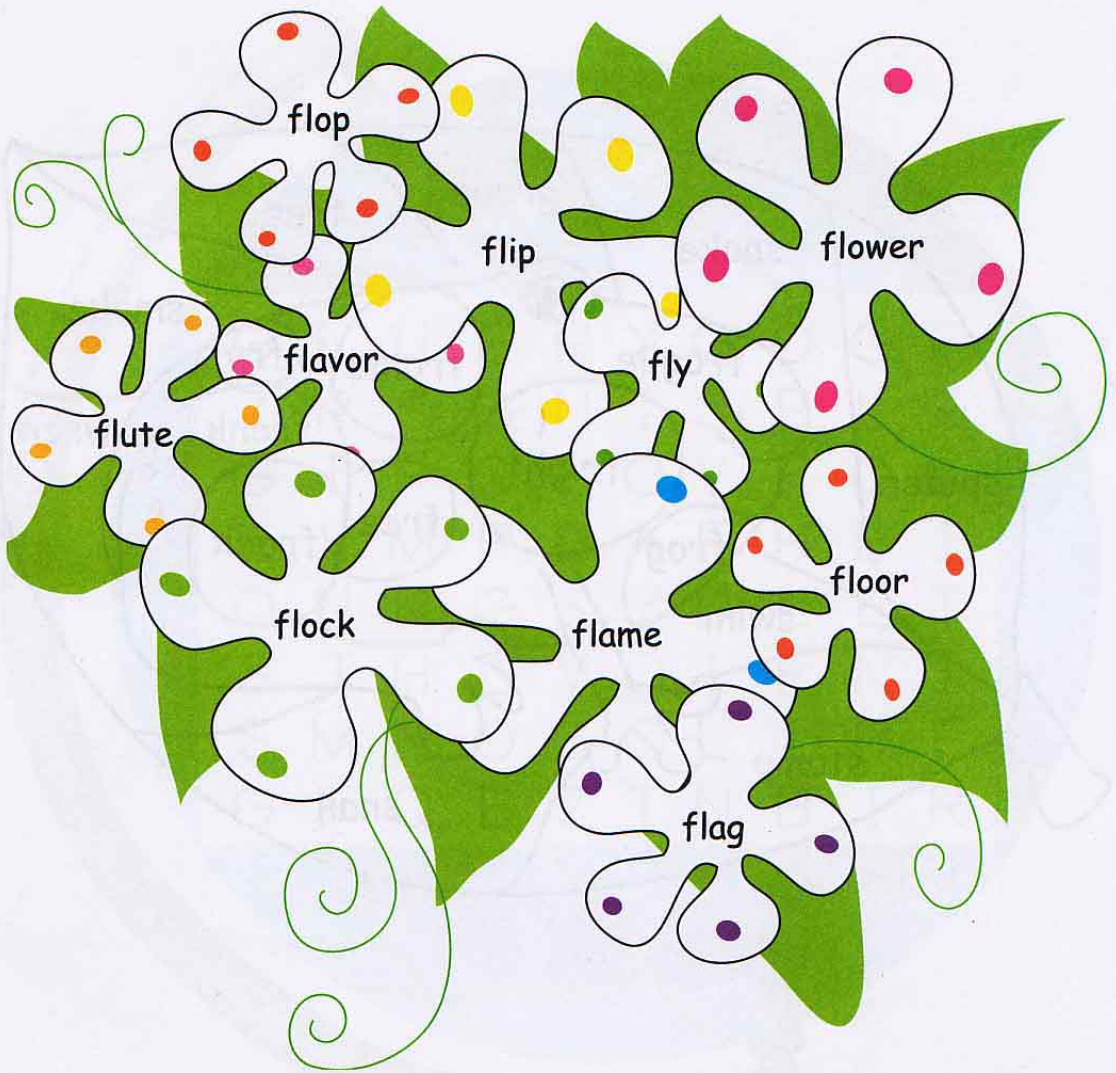

The Tale of Drew the Dragon

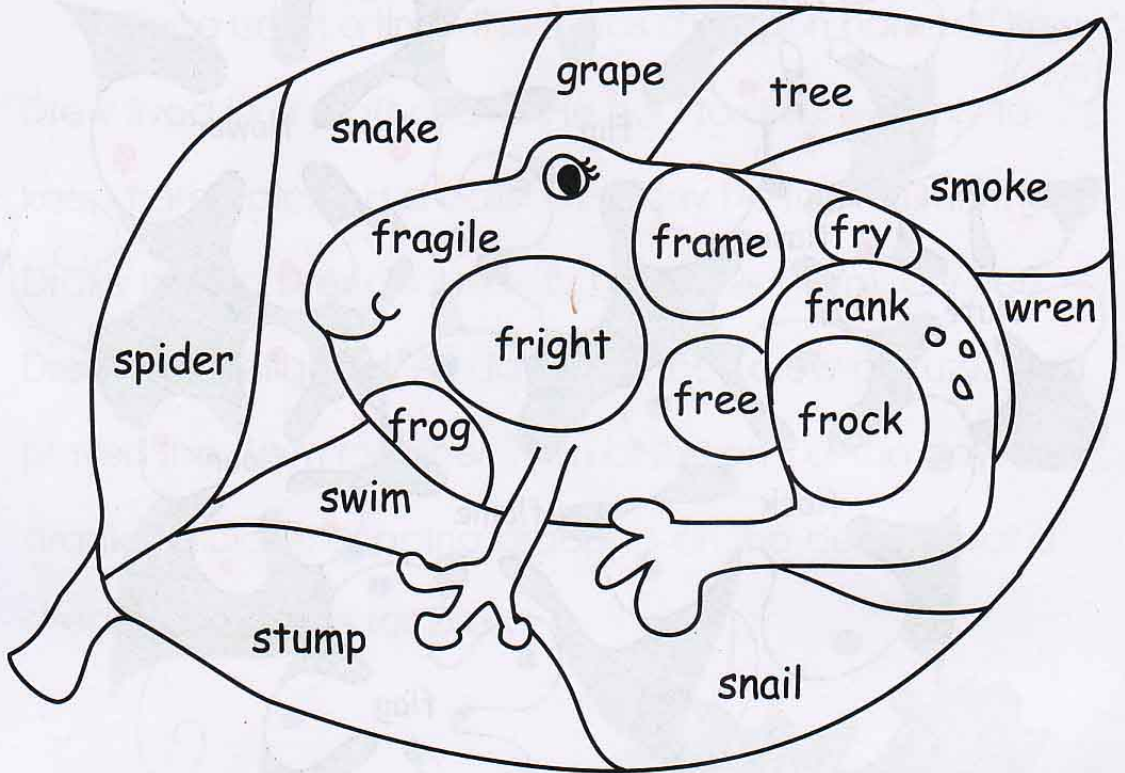
